Coach Wooden's amazing coaching career

- Led UCLA Bruins to four 30-0 seasons (1963-64, 1966-67, 1971-72, 1972-73)
- Led Bruins to 88 consecutive victories 1971-1974
- Led Bruins to 38 straight NCAA tournament victories
- Led Bruins to a 149-2 record at Pauley Pavilion
- Led Bruins to 10 national championships, including seven in a row (1967-73) amounting to 1/2 of all championships awarded in the 1960's and 1/2 of all championships awarded in the 1970's
- Selected by ESPN as the greatest coach ever
- In his final nine years as coach, Wooden compiles a 259-12 record (.956) – an average of 1.33 losses per season over 9 years
- Never had a losing season
- 9 years in a row in the Final Four
- Most wins without a loss in an NCAA championship final game by a coach – 10 (the most unbreakable record in all of sports)
- Only coach in NCAA basketball history with back to back perfect seasons (1971-72, 1972-73)
- Largest average margin of victory for a season – 30.3 points per game (1971-72) – including tournament
- Most seasons with one or fewer losses – 7
- Won 99 consecutive home games in a row
- Ranked #1 for longest period of time (from 2/9/71 to 1/15/74)
- Made 138 straight free throws in competition while playing professional basketball
